Countdown to harvest with SantoWines

EVER WONDER WHAT GOES INTO A BOTTLE OF WINE? We did, so we asked SantoWines to give us the "Harvest Countdown." The island's biggest producer, SantoWines receives about 70 percent of the total grapes produced in the Santorini vineyard.



Harvest starts in a few days: here's what it takes.
